### our History

The Great Plains Dinosaur Museum (GPDM) is governed and operated by the volunteer board of the Judith River Foundation, Inc., a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization established in 2002 to bring the exciting dinosaur discoveries of Phillips County to life. Our mission is to curate and prepare paleontological resources for educational programs, scientific research, and interpretive displays, advancing knowledge for the benefit of all.

The museum operates independently, without tax-dollar support or affiliations with municipal or higher education institutions. It is entirely self-funded through memberships, admissions, dig and tour revenue, and fundraising efforts.

GPDM originated as a volunteer-run Dinosaur Field Station in 2002, located near the Malta railroad underpass. In 2008, a new 3,000-square-foot facility was built adjacent to the Phillips County Museum on US Highway 2 in Malta, Montana, thanks in part to a \$500,000 special appropriation from the State of Montana. The museum property is owned by the City of Malta and leased to GPDM under a long-term agreement.

Today, the museum continues to inspire visitors and support its mission through community-driven efforts and the dedication of its volunteer leadership.



Visitation estimate for 2024 = 2700 guests



Of the overall total, less than 5% were from Phillips County





### \$\$ Preliminary Architect Report (PAR)for Expansion

Partner with Mt. Dinosaur Trail seeking grant funds from Pilot Community Tourism Grant Program (PCTGP) - deadline 12/2024. PAR process includes ientifying needs, options, budget feasibility. Hire an architect, begin process, identify funding sources. Needs - dedicated fossil prep lab, onsite storage, dedicated federal fossil repository.



#### Collaborate with other tourism interests.

Trafton Trailhead effort by Malta Trails, Night Skies effort by Missouri River Country, 20th and 25th Anniversaries of Montana Dinosaur Trail. Continue our partnership with Fukui Dinosaur Museum.



#### Improve operations.

Secure/fund operations Manager, Continue financially successful programming, secure additional landowners for fossil exploration, BLM permits for exploring and excavation on public lands, research benefits of fossil repository, strong volunteer program to extend seasons of operations.
